On a Non-Technical Note


If you have preschool children, you know who Thomas the Tank Engine is. And in fact, a lot of kids a little bit older than preschool still love Thomas.

Open Source Solutions with PHP and MySQL

Wow, what a year! At the Spring 2006 COMMON Conference, IBM and Zend announced that Zend would bring PHP to i5/OS. Since that time, over 5,000 people have registered at zend.com to download Zend's PHP runtime and development products for i5/OS. System i customers are taking advantage of PHP to develop and deploy web applications. Customers are telling us that with PHP they are able to quickly respond to business requirements, sometimes putting new web applications into production within weeks. Customers are finding it easy to integrate PHP applications with i5/OS applications and data. We have also seen customers leverage the large PHP community through some of the over 10,000 components and applications, the over 4.5 million trained developers, and by being very active on the Zend forums. With its easy-to-use development approach, PHP is a natural fit for i5/OS customers and developers offering improved productivity and rapid deployment.

Zend has delivered Zend Core, Zend Studio, and Zend Platform for i5/OS. While starting with i5/OS V5R4 support, in response to customer feedback, Zend has recently delivered V5R3 support as well. System i customers can order Zend Core for i5/OS and Zend Studio Professional for i5/OS from IBM with three years of standard support, or download them from Zend's Web site for no additional charge. Zend Core for i5/OS is a fully tested and enhanced version of the open source PHP runtime environment. Zend Core for i5/OS features a toolkit that will allow PHP applications to use DB2 for i5/OS to make program calls and procedures calls, and to access message queues, data areas, and data queues. Zend Studio Professional for i5/OS provides an integrated development environment for PHP. Zend Professional runs on a Windows, Linux, or MAC client. Zend Platform provides enhanced performance, scalability, and monitoring for PHP application deployments.

To extend the open source capabilities of i5/OS, on April 25, 2007 at the MySQL Conference and Expo, IBM and MySQL Inc. announced that MySQL will deliver the MySQL Community Server and MySQL Enterprise Server database for i5/OS on the System i platform. In addition, IBM and MySQL are planning to deliver a DB2 storage engine for MySQL on i5/OS. With the DB2 Storage Engine, System i customers will be able to run MySQL applications while continuing to manage the DB2 for i5/OS database. In addition, the DB2 Storage Engine will enable sharing of data between MySQL and DB2 applications. DB2 for i5/OS provides a scalable, easy to use database for transaction processing, business intelligence, and collaborative applications. The DB2 Storage Engine will plug into the MySQL Server and can be managed as any other storage engine within the server. The new DB2 Storage Engine will provide storage management, transaction support, and data management capabilities for MySQL.

Third Annual Innovation Award Winner: Gateway Technical College

Gateway Technical College in Southeastern-most corner of Wisconsin, brought together the local System i user group with current students to increase job opportunities for graduating students and to educate businesses of the latest System i tools and technology. Jim Buck, an IT System i programming instructor, identified an untapped opportunity for Gateway Technical College, which has had an IBM Midrange Programmer/Analyst program for 15 years. The program developed evening and one-day seminars; created an advisory board with recruited local professionals to help design the System i curriculum; and created networking opportunities for students. Gateway Technical College has earned the award for Education Excellence.

Education Excellence in Depth

Gateway Technical College has had an IBM midrange platform-oriented Information Technology-Programmer Analyst (P/A) program for over fifteen years. The popularity of the platform is very strong among businesses within 60 miles of Gateway Technical College's district in Southeastern Wisconsin, which includes the Chicago and Milwaukee areas, driving the need for classes and continued training.

Coming from industry five years ago to serve as Gateway's new P/A instructor, Jim Buck identified an opportunity to refresh the curriculum and equipment as well as develop relationships with businesses using IBM's midrange platform. Gateway purchased a new IBM model 800 and Jim worked with other Gateway instructors to update the curriculum to include the following languages: RPG IV ILE, JAVA, VB.net, and WDSc (IBM's advanced development platform). The college also offers a WebSphere Advanced Technology Certificate which includes classes in Advanced Java, WebSphere Administration, Web Integration Tools and, starting this fall, Enterprise Generation Language.

Relationships were established with regional businesses through the Wisconsin Midrange Computer Programmers Association (WMCPA) and Jim is beginning his fourth term as president of this organization. He currently holds IBM certifications in WebSphere Technical Solutions and iSeries System Command Operations. His actions in updating curriculum and equipment, and in establishing close connections with the System i user community, have been all been targeted towards increasing students' job opportunities and assisting area businesses in locating highly skilled workers.

Going forward Buck wants to increase Gateway's training for IT professionals working in the field and wishing to advance their skills. Gateway also plans on teaching System i Concepts at the high school level. The challenge Jim foresees will be selling the platform to high school students making their first career choice. He is looking for creative ways to explain to students who play computer games what the System i is all about and what it could mean to their future in terms of salary and job satisfaction.
